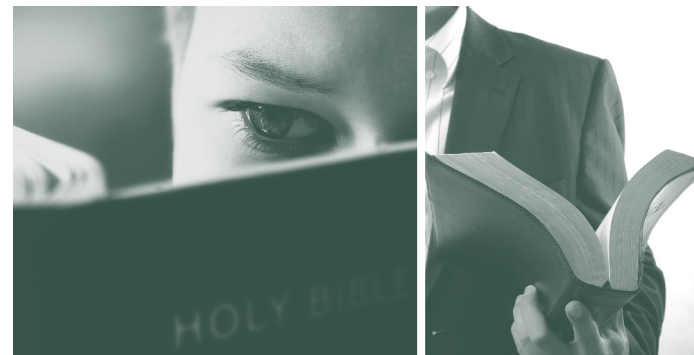
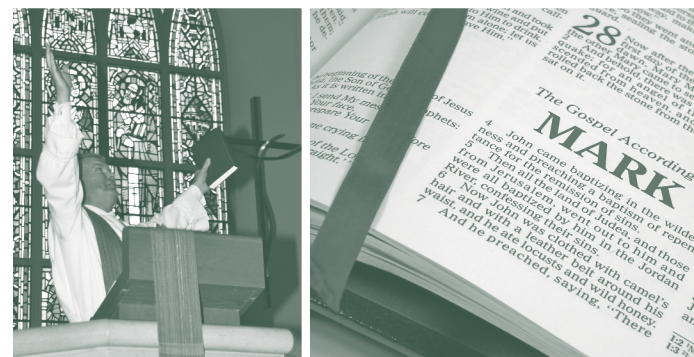

## The Centrality of Application in Biblical Preaching Featuring Dr. Michael Duduit

Concordia Seminary will host its Eleventh Annual Day of Homiletical Reflection on May 8, 2013, from 9:15 a.m. to 4:15 p.m. The event is designed for pastors, students involved in homiletical education, and all others interested in the proclamation of the Gospel in today's world. The cost for the event is \$25, not including lunch. A total of .4 CEUs is available.

The Day of Homiletical Reflection combines the annual Wenchel Lecture that promotes critical thought about preaching and practical enhancement in this art with the Ernie and Elsie Schneider Endowment for Excellence in Preaching that fosters support for innovative 21st century proclamation.

## Main Presenter

Michael Duduit is founding Dean of the College of Christian Studies at Anderson University in Anderson, S.C., where he also serves as Professor of Christian Ministry. He previously served as an administrator and teacher at several institutions, including

Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, Palm Beach Atlantic University, Samford University, and Union University. He also serves as Executive Editor of *Preaching* magazine, a publication he founded in 1985. Michael is founder and director of the National Conference on Preaching



and the International Congress on Preaching. He writes *PreachingNow*, a weekly email newsletter read by more than 50,000 pastors and church leaders. A graduate of Stetson University and Southern Baptist Seminary, he received a Ph.D. in humanities from Florida State University. He is the author or editor of more than a dozen books, including the *Handbook of Contemporary Preaching*, *Joy in Ministry*, *Preaching With Power*, and *Communicate With Power*.

## Lecture

### Dr. Michael Duduit - "The Centrality of Application in Biblical Preaching"

With the renewal of interest in expository preaching in recent years, too often preachers have sought to be "biblical" through an emphasis on transmitting biblical content. This session will focus on the New Testament perspective on preaching, which is not primarily on transmitting information but on setting the stage for life transformation. In biblical preaching, application must not be one among several elements; application is the very heart and purpose of the preaching task.

## Sectionals

### Dr. Michael Duduit - "Crafting a Life Purpose Sermon"

If application is at the heart of the preaching task, how do we build our sermons around that priority? In this session we will explore how to create an application-centered expository message. The workshop will include a step-by-step process for planning and shaping a "Life Purpose Sermon" from a biblical text.

### Dr. Reed Lessing - "Singing the Songs of Zion"

As Israelites traveled to Jerusalem to celebrate the Passover — the day of their deliverance — they sang Psalms 120-134. These songs of Zion enabled them to remember their caring and loving God who delivered them from Pharaoh's tyranny and ushered them into a new life of freedom. "Singing the Songs of Zion" is also our way of remembering the ultimate Passover — Christ's death that delivers us from our enemy, the devil, and his partners, sin and death.

### Dr. Glenn Nielsen - "Preaching the Resurrection Hope -- For the Last Day and Every Day"

Jesus' resurrection is more than just the validation of what He did on Good Friday. It speaks to our final day resurrection, moving beyond the interim state's message of resting in Jesus' presence to the vibrant hope of that last great day of Jesus' return. Even more, such resurrection preaching speaks to our daily lives

now as we seek to become a part of God's answer to the petition, "Thy kingdom come." Since our last day hope is that God will redeem his creation in its physicality, this world and our earthly lives are not something to be abandoned or defiled in selfish consumption. Instead, our resurrection hope compels us to bring glimpses, moments, of that hope every day in spite of the opposition of that last great enemy — death and its evil allies.
