Flexibility is important in today's changing culture. Distance programs and increased online capabilities have provided new ways to educate students while not compromising on theological training or formation.

As an example, the Specific Ministry Pastor (SMP) program provides a distance-based route to ordination for men already serving in Lutheran ministry. In addition, we have developed distance programs for Hispanic, ethnic immigrant and students who are deaf that enable us to reach communities not typically well-represented in The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod.

Continuing education (CE) also is a priority for us. Many CE classes are offered on campus and online for both pastors and laypeople. Theological resources are widely available online through ConcordiaTheology.org and iTunes U, where you'll find sermon helps, Bible studies, faculty blog posts, podcasts and much more.
